I am enjoying teaching very much here. The children are very friendly and enthusiastic to learn. I teach really young children from 6 years to teenagers of 15 years.

Here are some photos taken on school outings to a temple in the mountains and also to a natural history museum, which features me standing alongside a model of a C17th Dutch explorer. I am trying to read as much as possible about the culture and history of Taiwan and the Asian region.

The food is very interesting and yummy. There are some things to avoid like live Eels!! I have had a few memorable meals of roast duck.

I have made a few friends here, but it will still take a fair bit of time to settle in I realise. I didn't secure the position I came for initially in the science and industrial hub of Hsinchu, but instead got a position in a smaller school in a quieter and smaller city called Chaiyi. This has advantages and disadvantages. There are very few fluent English speakers here, which does motivate me to learn Mandarin Chinese. I met a Rotarian about 3 weeks ago and had a very simple conversation with him. I expressed my interest in visiting the club. I dont think I will join it, but rather wait until next year. I will probably move schools and to a larger city then and a Rotary club with English speakers will be more possible.

I have travelled around a little but there are some adventures which will also have to wait like mountain trails and surfing.

I hope that this gives everyone an idea of my doings. I do dip into Bay Breezes and I am grateful to receive club emails and updates.
