I have no doubt that Keith has prepared a full and eventful presentation for Tuesday. One which we can all look forward to.

#### **ROTARY FAMILY HEALTH DAY [RFHD]**

Patrick and Ali Rice have been hard at work with June Webber attending the various workshops and attending to the minutiae of criteria on this massive event.

This year we are also being joined by RC of Am Kap. Club Sec Anneliese Brandt of Am Kap is working with Patrick and Ali at present and attending the various workshops with them.

Don't forget that the main RFHD event is taking place on 3rd and 4th April this year and it will be a case again of "all hands to the wheel". Initially we were down to these two days, given limited access to the meeting hall in IY. But Patrick has added an extra day on 8th April specifically for eye tests.

Last year we had 150 odd eye referrals and Rotary with Lions had a special health day with Yonga Trust Eye Clinic, a travelling ophthalmic grouping. This was about two months after last year's RFHD and we kitted out 53 individuals with special readers @R30 to R40ea. Rotary and Lions shared the bill of about R5,000 for those and Yonga referred the balance on for special treatment, i.e. cataracts, glaucoma etc etc.

RFHD last year and the Yonga initiative were very successful. Despite RFHD teething problems which were inevitable in the roll out of something so huge, we managed to get around these and perform a service to the community for which we, and particularly Patrick can be proud.

No doubt Patrick or Ali will be approaching us for availability times and dates but please do as much as you can. Put in all the time you can manage and we shall have an event to be proud of.
