Uranquinty Power Station is a 640 MW gas-fired peaking power station – one of the largest open cycle gas turbine (OCGT) power stations in Australia. It is designed to generate power at times of high demand, for example in summer when air conditioners tend to be extensively used and throughout winter when there is high demand for heating. It is the only power station of its type in New South Wales
