Topic of the Day: Cloud Computing

The guest speaker of the day was Carla Viezee from File It Africa, a company that offers data backup and storage solutions; cloud computing.



Carla Viezee - File it Africa

Conventional data storage methods leave data at a higher risk of getting lost or compromised, hence Cloud Computing. With Cloud Computing, data is stored in a remote server and can be accessed anytime, anywhere; all you need is a password.

Using a secure, remote server gives room for expanded use of computers or smart phones since one will never run out of storage space.

Some characteristics of cloud computing

- Storage space is sold on demand, meaning that one can upgrade or expand their storage bundle.
- Cloud computing is elastic; meaning that the user can have as much or as little service as they want
- Files are stored in highly secured servers; nobody can access your files or delete them.
- You can share or send large files online
- Data is automatically backed up in real time of saved files from your computer using secure internet connection, and is stored in state of the art servers away from your premises.
- You can access your stored files from anywhere e.g. Hotel, airport, office, home; all you need is an internet connection, a computer or a smart phone and your password.
