going so far: the positives, issues, improvements, etc. There were also speakers who spoke on how to deal with difficult people and leadership styles in relation to recent information on right brain/left brain research. Paul Murray informed those assembled about the new district website called Club Runner. Ken Engsmyr shared information on the promotion material for RYLA (Youth Leadership). This material has been passed onto Leslie to discuss at the last Board meeting for the year. An evaluation was also shared about the PETS training this year and the District

Assembly so that any changes can be made for next year if necessary.

One of the main messages Marg took home from the meeting was to make sure we put fun into Rotary. There was also healthy discussion about attendance, the main issue being active involvement is more important than just being a member. Membership was also discussed, and a few ideas to increase membership were shared [e.g. invite prospective members to working bees and social outings, talk to people (follow up personal contact), information night for prospective members, and perhaps say "we're going to Rotary" rather than "we're going to a Rotary meeting," which some felt might turn people off].

Marg found the session to be quite informative and helpful as she's half way through her Presidency – "to know that we're definitely on track and that some of the changes we have made so far have been well received by others, too."
