Dinner was prepared by the Sports Club, Marg and Garth Perkin and cooked by Garth.

The guest speaker was Deb Bewick from Wagga who gave an excellent talk on autism. This was a talk from the heart by a mother who has an autistic child. Deb gave us all a very thorough insight into what autism does and how it can be managed. The work of such parents and carers is to be admired by all of us in society today.

Deb explained in great detail that autism is a lifelong neurodevelopment disorder that begins at birth. There are many symptoms including anxiety, impaired social skills, and language and communication difficulties. Autistic people have difficulty understanding the verbal inputs of other humans and have great difficulty in starting and maintaining conversations.

Deb showed us a toolbox of tricks and aids that go towards providing help to autistic people. These include speech-generating devices, sensory aids, and physical aids such as spinning tops and stretching dolls. Other aids include colour-coded cards to help the children coordinate their day.

All in all Deb gave a wonderful talk and we all are better for her experience, passion and dedication. Visiting Rotarian Christine Atkinson thanked Deb on behalf of our club with a Rotary Cook Book.

She is also the parent of 16-year-old Monique who suffers from autism, as well as epilepsy and an intellectual disability. Monique goes to Willans Hill School and is learning to communicate using visuals and speech aid technologies. Deb was very interesting with her powerpoint presentation and the different aids she brought to show us what helps to make life easy for Monique and her family. These included tactile objects which help to soothe Monique when she becomes distracted or off task.

We learnt that autism is a broad term that encompasses a range of abilities and strengths. Perhaps Einstein suffered from Autism yet he has left an amazing legacy to Mankind. There are also other disabilities that can also affect people with autism. All this makes it very hard on families but Deb can be proud of the way she has adapted to meet Monique's and her family's needs.

It was great that Andrew from the Club was able to cater for us and he did an excellent job. I don't think anyone was unhappy with their meal (I hope not anyway!).

I just wanted to acknowledge Grahame in particular and his team for the efforts they are making for the Market Day and Monster Raffle. Grahame has been working hard consistently for some time now, so thank you Grahame. I'm sure your efforts will be well rewarded on the day and at the conclusion of the Raffle.
