After introducing our many guests, Marg presented Daniel Knimpson of the Forever Young Committee with a check for \$1000 from Coolamon Rotary to assist with the construction of the park being constructed in honour of Daniel Piltz and Catherine Furner, two local youngsters who died recently from cancer.

After enjoying dinner, those assembled were treated to an engaging talk by John Glassford (with contributions from John Lonergan and Mark Janetzki) describing their recent adventure in Uganda to climb the Mountains of the Moon. John

described the grueling trek through hilly, boggy terrain with treacherous creek crossings on



dodgy bridges, where 2.5 km travelled in a 12-hour day was considered good progress. The effort took a lot out of the intrepid climbers, and only one member of the Aussie team (Fred Madden of Bathurst) and Moses, the lead guide, made it to the top of Mt. Margherita, the target peak.

John then showed photos and videos of the beneficiaries of the funds raised by the climb (and other efforts), the orphans of AIDS-stricken communities in Uganda, Tanzania, and South Africa. It's great to see what a positive impact these programs are having on the lives of these disadvantaged children, but of course there's always more that needs to be done.

Thanks, John and company, for your excellent presentation and superlative efforts to help such needy citizens of the world.
