Regular Meeting - 2 April, 2012

President Marg called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. The main items of business were soliciting volunteers for two upcoming events: the markets at the Up-To-Date Store on the 15th of April and the racing event at the showgrounds on ANZAC Day. After concluding business and enjoying food and fellowship, we listened to an emotional and inspiring talk by Melina Skidmore, the founder and CEO of Angels for the Forgotten. Melina described a very sad tale of abuse at the hands of a dysfunctional mother, uncaring foster parents (144 homes over the space of several years!), and an abusive husband.

Despite these hardships, or perhaps because of them, Milena founded Angels for the Forgotten, a charitable organization that caters to the needs of foster children as well as single parents in needy It's truly remarkable that a woman as young as Milena has done so much to assist foster children throughout Australia, who unfortunately are woefully under-cared for by government agencies. With a tiny staff of co-workers, Angels for the Forgotten distributes care packages to foster children (who often are taken from their homes with nothing but the clothes on their backs) and to victims of natural disasters (e.g. the recent floods in the RIverina), as well as running programs to assist at-risk single parents and youngsters. This is all accomplished with a shoestring budget consisting mainly of contributions from a few wealthy benefactors. All in attendance were moved by the presentation, and will be investigating ways to raise funds for such a deserving organization.

I know they really enjoyed their time in Coolamon. Thank you to the families who hosted them (Glassfords, Burns, Durhams, Miles and Perkins). Also to Ian J. who set the itinerary and drove the bus for the past 2 days, ably assisted by other Rotarians. Thank you also to John, who drove Mark to Narrandera this afternoon so he could visit his sick, elderly aunt. The team only have one more club to visit before Jamie and Mark head back home and Ann and Amanda travel up the coast from Melbourne to Sydney for a few weeks and Peter heads to Melbourne to catch up with his sister then they too head back to Scotland.

Garth, John, Susan and I attended the District conference, the Glassfords for the whole weekend and Garth and I for the Sunday. By all accounts it was a good conference. Garth and I certainly enjoyed the quality of presentations we heard. Probably the most moving for me was Bernie Rogers, PDG, who was born with polio and has been actively involved in its eradication. Glenys McDonald spoke of the search she has been involved in of the HMAS Sydney.

March is Literacy month in Rotary.

The Temora club has invited us to their club on the 16th April for an interplast talk. It will cost \$20/head. They need to know numbers by the 13th April. If you intend going, please give your name to Garth. I'm sure we can organise a car pool.

2 April - What an amazing lady, Melina Skidmore. She certainly had a story to share and she did this so eloquently. Melina founded Angels for the Forgotten after a very difficult early life which inspired her to set up the program. Angels for the Forgotten is a program dedicated to making a difference and real impact in the lives of children who live in and out of foster homes or crisis accommodation through the provision of special care packages, resources, information and support. Milena actually had no packages to show us as they had all been used in the recent Wagga floods. The members of the club in attendance were inspired to help out in some way, which will be discussed at the next Board meeting.

Melina told me while we were eating that she has 4 children, each of whom have special needs, 2 with autism. So is quite an amazing person who has done something positive to alleviate the plight of children. She doesn't want others to suffer the difficulties she had in early life.

Remember to support the Market day as best you can. A roster is currently being devised.

The Harness Club require assistance on ANZAC Day. I have contacted Wendy Dennis to let her know the Perkins and Westons will be able to help out. She will let me know what jobs she wants done. If you can help out, let Garth know.
