

Regular club meeting – 14 May

The meeting was primarily social in nature. After a satisfying meal prepared by Gilbert, the members were treated to a travelogue by Garth, who described a recent trip he took with Marg to Broken Hill and points west. Garth recounted the history of the town, which was built by the fortunes of early prospectors who mined mainly silver from the area. Garth and Marg's trip featured a visit to the Royal Flying Doctor Service, a vital health resource to Australians living in the bush. The service provides health care to Aussies living far from medical and dental care facilities, and is quite literally a lifeline to those living in remote areas. Garth showed a video provided by the RFDS, and all who witnessed this soon realised how important even routine dental visits are to those living in rural and regional communities (a visit from the flying doctors might mean a few less do-it-yourself remedies that some folks in the outback have resorted to).

Of course, services such as the RFDS rely on dontations from individuals and service organisations such as Rotary. Garth made a similar presentation to the Temora Rotary Club recently in an effort to persuade that club to take the lead in Rotary-based fundraising efforts, given the importance of aviation to Temora. Watch this space.

The meeting concluded with an impromptu raffle of a bottle of port, with the winning ticket ironically held by non-drinker John Burns. John graciously shared his prize with those in attendance. The meeting concluded at 8:35 pm.

Over 300 Rotarians and guests attended to reception held at the Wagga Wagga Country Club.
