DG Neal Fogarty spoke of many things and we all enjoyed the talk and their company through the evening. Neal spoke of his upbringing and his life in the Department of Agriculture specializing in sheep genetics. Neal looked at getting the lamb industry on a par with our wine industry. The aim to get lamb on fine dining menus in Australia and overseas particularly the USA.

Neal has been a Rotarian for 26 years and joined the Cowra club when asked to come a long to a meeting by his neighbour. "Have you asked your neighbour to join our meetings?" Neal and Barbara have lived in the USA in particular Nebraska. Their eldest daughter lives in New York now with their two granddaughters. Neal and Barbara have been heavily involved with Rotary including attending the World Convention in Montreal, the International Assembly in San Diego.


Neal went on to praise our club and the amount of local community work that we do alongside our international projects in Africa. In particular Neal explained that the 42 clubs in our district in 12 months has put \$1.5 million back into local community projects. He feels that would be 5 times more if you include work in kind.

Neal went onto explain how close we are to defeating polio in the world. We are so close. In 1985 there were 350,000 new cases which have dropped to 2,000 in 2010. Only 4 countries are still endemic with polio. Neal encouraged us to keep going with our international and local community projects and cited Griffith Avanti with their cows for Rwanda project, and the RC of Parkes building in Vanuatu.

Neal concluded his talk with an invitation to all of us and our partners to attend the district conference in Orange on April 1st to 3rd.

The meeting closed at 8.45pm and we all then enjoyed some excellent fellowship. Our visiting Rotarian, John McKenny, hails from Glen Innes and was in Coolamon on business looking at the Shire's swimming pools. We exchanged club banners and look forward to John's next visit.

Progress for Rotary's US\$200 Million Challenge for polio eradication

Polio has been around for thousands of years. Roman emperor Claudius may have had it. Author Sir Walter Scott had it. Golfer Jack Nicklaus, Kim Beazley and filmmaker Francis Ford Coppola had it. In fact, when lack of sanitation was a problem everywhere, nearly everyone caught polio. Even the ancient Egyptians had it.

Most people don't have any symptoms and never realize they were infected. Some feel mildly ill; their bodies fight off the virus as they might the flu. In a small percentage of cases, the virus spreads to the central nervous system. Fewer than one in 100 infected people get a paralytic form of the disease. When this happens, the virus destroys motor neurons, the nerve cells that control muscles.

IN THE 1950S, LEG BRACES used by polio victims were made of heavy iron or steel posts with padded leather straps. The metal posts connected to the heel of an adapted shoe. Each brace could weigh up to 15 pounds. Today's braces, made of plastics or high-quality metals, are much lighter; a metal full-leg brace can weigh as little as 4 pounds. And braces are still needed in the four countries where polio continues to claim victims and in others where polio survivors live.

Because it was so easy to administer and gave longer-lasting immunity, the oral polio vaccine became the weapon of choice in the global campaign to eradicate polio. Sabin, an honorary Rotarian, gave the first drops of vaccine himself to launch Rotary's PolioPlus initiative in 1985.

As of 31 August 2010, Rotarians have raised about \$145 million for Rotary's US\$200 Million Challenge. These contributions will help Rotary raise \$200 million to match \$355 million in challenge grants received from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation


PROPOSED NEW DINNER BADGES.
