Munching machine

Farmer's makeshift invention to stop the locust plague

IT SUCKS, it slices and it dices — but wait, there's more. It could also be the answer to the state's locust plague.

This contraption, the "locust muncher", is one man's answer to controlling the ravenous insects that are invading regional NSW.

South Australian farmer Terry Bediavas is offering our farmers, who are facing the worst plague in 30 years, the prototype for his locust muncher.

Mr Bediavas said his primitive machine could help save what is expected to be the first bumper crop after the worst drought on record.

He said locusts needed to be sprayed while they were banding on the ground but once they took to the skies his muncher could clean up the adult insects.

"It may not look much but it does work and could be made into something more sophisticated," he said.

After locusts ravaged his crops, Mr Bediavas built his makeshift muncher. Using a fan, garden rakes and a grate from the fridge, he assembled the machine and welded it onto his ute.

"It works like a huge vacuum that sucks in locusts, shreds them and dispels them," Mr Bediavas said. "It only works when they fly."
