### **GUEST SPEAKERS**

Susan and John Glassford spoke on their recent trip to Samoa. They stayed at the Virgin Cove Resort in Saanapu on the main island of Samoa; Upolu. They also visited the areas devastated by the tsunami in September 2009.

John has some ideas on how we can continue to support Samoans. These will be discussed with the incoming board and president-elect Marg Perkin for 2011-2012.

#### SAMOA FACTS AND FIGURES.

Samoa officially the Independent State of Samoa, formerly known as Western Samoa and German Samoa, is a country encompassing the western part of the Samoan Islands in the South Pacific Ocean. It became independent from New Zealand in 1962. The two main islands of Samoa are Upolu and one of the biggest islands in Polynesia, Savai'i. The capital city, Apia, and Faleolo International Airport are situated on the island of Upolu.

The oldest date so far from pre-historic human remains in Samoa has been *calculated* by New Zealand scientists to a likely true age of circa 3,000 BP (Before Present)

At the turn of the twentieth century, the Tripartite Convention partitioned the Samoan Islands into two parts the eastern island group became a territory of the United States (the Tutuila Islands in 1900 and officially Manu'a in 1904) and is today known as American Samoa; the western islands, by far the greater landmass, became known as German Samoa after Britain vacated all claims to Samoa and accepted termination of German rights in Tonga and certain areas in the Solomon Islands and West Africa.

In 1914 New Zealand sent a warship to Apia and the Germans handed over the country and after the war in 1919 Samoa was officially handed over to New Zealand by the Germans.

From the end of World War I until 1962, New Zealand controlled Samoa as a Class C Mandate under trusteeship through the League of Nations After repeated efforts by the Samoan people, Western Samoa gained independence in 1962 and signed a Friendship Treaty with New Zealand. Samoa was the first country in the Pacific to become independent.

Samoans' religious adherence includes the following: Christian Congregational Church of Samoa 35.5%, Roman Catholic 19.6%, Methodist 15%, Latter-day Saints 12.7%, Samoan Assemblies of God 10.6%, Seventh-day Adventist 3.5%, Worship Centre 1.3%, unspecified 0.8%.

## HAPPY BIRTHDAY ROTARY 106 YEARS OLD 23rd FEBRUARY 2011



The first four Rotarians -- Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, Hiram E. Shorey, Paul P. Harris.

On 23 February 1905, Paul P. Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram E. Shorey gathered in Loehr's office for what would become known as the first Rotary club meeting. *Harris's desire for camaraderie among business associates* brought together these four men and eventually led to an international organization of service and fellowship.

Rotary's founder, **Harris**, a lawyer, was born in Wisconsin, USA, on 19 April 1868. He was raised by his paternal grandparents in Vermont and attended the University of Vermont, Princeton, and the University of Iowa. He was Rotary president from 1910 to 1912 and a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago until his death on 27 January 1947.

**Loehr**, a mining engineer, was born on 18 October 1864 in Carlinville, Illinois. He was a Rotarian for only a few years, never holding office at the club or international level. But that first Rotary meeting was held in his office, Room 711 of the Unity Building in downtown Chicago. He died in Chicago on 23 May 1918.

A Rotarian for only a few years, **Shorey** served as recording secretary during the club's first year. He was born in Maine in August 1862 and died in March 1944.

**Schiele**, a coal dealer, served as the Chicago club's first president in 1905 and Rotary International's third treasurer in 1945. Born in Terre Haute, Indiana, in 1870, Schiele attended Terre Haute Business College and served in the U.S. Army during the Spanish-American War. He was president of the Schiele Coal Company from 1902 until his retirement in 1939. He and Harris became lifelong friends and lived near each other on the South Side of Chicago. Schiele died on 17 December 1945 and is buried near Harris at Mount Hope Cemetery.

Today 106 years on Rotary has over 1.2 million members in 210 countries with some 34,005 clubs.
