3. District 9700 Conference



The raffle tonight, a laundry basket, was won by Grahame Miles. (Too late for a Valentine's Day present Grahame).



THE INTERNET IN NORTH AFRICA TODAY

A post from Omar Filali President Rotary Club Casa-Nord D9010 Morocco

This arrived today Tuesday 22nd February at 9.30 am, and I felt that it may be of interest to you all and how the internet is spreading news in a timely manner. At the same time changing governments, as seen in Tunisia and Egypt. This post comes from Morocco and a fellow member of ROTI, Rotarians on the Internet.

"Dear Rotarians,

In these times of unrest all over the Arab world, even though I am worried now about my beloved country (Morocco), I still believe we're an exception in the Middle East and in North Africa.

Why? We live in a politically and economically free land.

Yesterday, like every Sunday, I was running through the city center of Casablanca. Some people were demonstrating in a civilized way, others were watching them and others were at cafés.

This was the situation in most cities. But after the demonstrations, in Marrakesh, Tangiers, Al Hoceima and in a couple of other cities some looters attacked bank branches, shops and restaurants. Five looters who were attacking a bank died because of a fire that they started themselves I was very sad to watch such videos...

The police behaved in a very civilized way most of the time and the Ministry of interior issued a transparent communiqué (cf. http://www.map.ma/eng/sections/home/five_people_charred/view).

Today, life was quite, expect in a few cities where some young people did some looting.

These movements started after a group of young people asked for a demonstration on Feb. 20 on Facebook. They called for a press conference and explained their points of view. They were asking for a constitutional reform and for more freedom. But these young friends don't even master their mother tongue and talk about issues that are bigger than them.

I believe that the social media allowed these young people to access huge masses of citizens. Unfortunately, most of my fellow citizens just want to imitate what is happening in the region. A better assessment of the current regional situation might have led our friends to cancel the demonstrations. That's why some of the young leaders withdrew from the Feb. 20 movement.

Our young king took command in 1999. Since then, he launched huge reforms and there is still a lot to do. Cities are unrecognizable because of the projects that are going on everywhere. My country is a constitutional monarchy and should still work on education and start a huge reform of its justice system. Corruption is still a big issue too. But we're on the good track. Some of our rivals would wish to see us fail. But make sure: in Morocco, the Libyan scenario is NOT AN OPTION. (by the way: It is unfortunate to witness such brutality in Tripoli).

I had the chance to travel to a few countries in Europe, America, Africa and Asia. My conclusion is that Morocco is one of the nicest places where to live on planet earth.
