AN EXAMPLE TO OTHERS: Ilyasi Siraji, a Ugandan refugee, opened the 2011 Rotary conference on Saturday morning. He is pictured with past president of Rotary Club of Orange North Michael Tindale who headed the organising committee for the huge event.

Ilyasi was born in war torn Democratic Republic of Congo, formerly known as Zaire. Ilyasi's mother passed away and his father went missing in the Congolese conflict. At a very young age Ilyasi was responsible for caring for his siblings. In desperation he and his siblings fled to Uganda and were reunited with one of his sisters.

MORE than 500 delegates to the Rotary conference for District 9700 in Orange were told by Ugandan refugee Ilyasi Siraji the service organisation had made a huge contribution to the way he and his young siblings have settled into Australia after being granted humanitarian visas.

Mr. Siraji, 23 who now lives in Adelaide inspired Rotary delegates to the conference by his determination to make a better life for himself and his younger siblings when they lost both parents in Uganda.

"I was invited along to a Rotary youth leadership event and it all went from there, I was very much welcomed and it was a good feeling," he said.

Mr. Siraji, who is now studying a double degree in law and teaching, said living a life without fear is something he really appreciates about living in Australia.

Without a doubt one of the most inspiring speakers at the right place and at the right time for our future as Rotary and it is no wonder that Michael will be speaking in New Orleans at the Rotary International Convention in May.

Some gems from Michael:

- Generation Y a huge opportunity to engage Gen Y in Rotary. 70% of Gen Y volunteer on a weekly basis. Gen Y is the 12-30 year old generation.
- They are ambitious and want a vehicle to perform volunteer work.
- Gen Y are experience driven and find that being patient is pointless, frustrating and unacceptable.
- Respect is a core value of Gen Y, as long as it is reciprocal.
- If they have not made a change in 6 weeks they move on, they do not have to wait.
- Gen Y like stories as truth is relative to them and experience is king as they want to be part of the action. We need to engage them in action in what we do.
- Gen Y are impressed by people like Bill Gates.

• Gen Y are not impressed by our rituals and regalia such as the president's collar, the bell, the flag, the Queen or the sergeant at arms.

Michael has also written three bestselling books. His first book, "The 'New' Rules of Engagement" focuses on demographic trends and strategies for engaging with Generation Y, while his more recent releases "Memento" and "Wisdom" are designed to help parents and grandparents pass on their stories and life lessons as a legacy to the next generation.
