#### SHELTERBOX AUSTRALIA

The latest news from Shelterbox reprinted from Rotary Down Under on line August edition.

ShelterBox Australia has endured a period of disarray and uncertainty. But it is back in business – as official affiliate in Australia of the ShelterBox Trust in the UK.

#### Australia sets model:

Previously ShelterBox was run in Australia as a project of one Rotary club. It now has a national board, with Rotary representation from all geographic areas in Australia together with appointments that represent significant stakeholders. The Board of ShelterBox Australia is also liaising closely with a number of Australian District Governors, with the intention of moving ShelterBox in Australia towards a multi-District, Rotary-supported program, reporting to our Institute.

#### **New Board**

The new board comprises four directors representing geographic areas. Greville Easte, who has been a ShelterBox rep for a number of years, represents Queensland/Northern Territory. Immediate Past District Governor John Cameron represents NSW/ ACT. Russell Perry, who has also been a ShelterBox rep for a number of years, represents Victoria and Tasmania. Tim Klar, a ShelterBox rep of a number of years, represents South Australia/Western Australia and is also the current chairman of ShelterBox.

#### **Global Affiliation**

Lasse Petersen, general manager of ShelterBox UK, is also on the board to represent the UK side of the operation. Peter Pearce, a well-respected ShelterBox response team (SRT) member who has had a number of deployments overseas with ShelterBox, joins the board to represent the interests of SRT members. Peter will also have board responsibility for selection and training of SRT members from Australia.

# **Wider Rotary Involvement**

Finally, the current Australian District Governors have asked immediate past RI Director John Lawrence to represent them both on the board and in consultations with the UK parent group to bring about desired changes. John brings a wealth of knowledge and experience from two years service on the RI board. His presence will also provide ready lines of communication with senior Rotary leaders at the global level.

# **Elections**

The four regional directors will retire in rotation and seek re-election from Rotary club members who have opted to become members of ShelterBox Australia. There will also be constraints on the length of time any person might serve on the board to ensure ongoing injection of new blood. The last three positions on the board will always be by appointment.

## Office established

We have established an office with staff and appropriate office equipment and computers in northern Sydney at 3/7 Sefton Road, Thornleigh, NSW, 2120. We also have arrangements in place with RAWCS Eastern Region similar to the old arrangement in Victoria, to enable any donor requiring a tax-deductible receipt to obtain one via the RAWCS overseas aid fund. Details of these arrangements are on the website, which is up and running again with a reconstituted, up-to-date roll of honour for donations.

# **Expansion continues**

It has 10 international affiliates, and applications for affiliation have also been received from Brazil, Philippines, Indonesia, Hong Kong and Spain. As this international expansion continues there are plans afoot to create a new logistics and deployment organisation called ShelterBox International, which will take over a number of the functions currently run by ShelterBox UK Trust in compliance with the UK Charities Trust. ShelterBox UK will then become a fund-raising affiliate similar to all the others, and relinquish its hands-on day-to-day control over the aid delivery side of the operation. ShelterBox Australia will be a party to all moves in this direction.

# **Looking forward**

As at the end of June, 2010, ShelterBox had delivered nearly 80,000 boxes worldwide since its inception. The continued growth of ShelterBox as a premier disaster relief organisation could not have been possible without all our Rotary friends. The relationship between Rotary and ShelterBox is important to all of us and has been of prime importance to the many victims of disaster that we have helped. We thank you for your continued support.

#### Board at ShelterBox HQ

As this goes to press the Board is consulting with ShelterBox UK in Cornwell – tying down the final documentation and arrangements and consulting with SBUK on the worldwide arrangements and discussing methods of demonstrating transparency.

As most of you know now we are planning to return to Africa in July 2011 to hike and climb the Mountains of the Moon or the Rwenzoris in Uganda as they are also known.

This week our good friend and Kili 28/8 head guide, Moses Kashumba from Tanzania, is travelling to Uganda. Moses will be doing a trial run up the Rwenzoris and to climb either Mount Stanley or Mount Margherita. Moses will report back with photos and an idea of what we are in for.

**Mount Stanley** 

Moses is a Chagga man and lives on the slopes of Mount Kilimanjaro, as does his clan who has been there for over 400 years. Mount Kilimanjaro is the homeland of the Chagga people, one of Tanzania's largest ethnic groups. It is fair to say that when you are in Moshi, Marangu or Machame, there is little indication that you are in a 'Chagga town'.

Today the Chaggas, despite their diverse origins, are renowned for having a strong sense of identity and pride. They are also amongst the richest and most powerful people in Tanzania, thanks in part to the fertile soils of Kilimanjaro, and in part to the Western education that they have been receiving for longer than almost any other tribe in Africa, Kilimanjaro being one of the first places to accept missionaries from Europe.

The beneficiaries include RFFA's Orphan Rescue Kits: Hout Bay Rotary's Operation Medical Hope in Hout Bay, South Africa: Bishop Masereka's Christian Foundation, Medical Care Centre, Uganda and one education related project to be decided, see our web site:
