


This Weeks Meeting



22nd January Meeting

A great meeting at the Wagga RSL club with a guest speaker or two. Kate Bowyer and Sarah Luff gave us a great off the cuff presentation on a group called Little Paths. One of the projects supported by Little Paths is based in Mwanza, Tanzania.

Kate went traveling through Tanzania and ended up staying 4 months after becoming attached to the children. She returned to Australia and set about raising funds. The organisation focuses on street kids and primary school aged kids, giving them a helping hand to get through school with uniforms and supplies. They have a full time local named peter who is trained as a social worker and helps the kids through their schooling and education.

The organisation also supports a youth centre in Battambang, Cambodia. One of Cambodia's primary industries is tourism and street kids are easily tempted into the sex trade and begging to get by. For the past 2 years they have been providing access to 3 meals a day and schooling for 80 to 100 street kids.

Little Paths provide all of these great programs by running fund raising events. Their next event is a Charity Ball and will be held on Friday the 15th of February at the Capital Nightclub in Baylis St. Tickets are \$90 each and include a 3 course meal and entertainment, doors open at 6:30pm.
