Staff saved my life

MY STORY started on Friday June 28. I was on my way to a business meeting at San Marco Restaurant in the V&A Waterfront scheduled for 11am.

I had parked my vehicle close to the Mugg & Bean and proceeded to the meeting venue.

The next thing I can remember is waking up in the Durbanville Mediclinic Intensive Care Unit.

I had had what doctors call a "warning stroke", at the Mugg & Bean, fallen and passed out.

The effective response from the V&A Waterfront Security personnel saved my life and I cannot be grateful enough. They stabilised me, phoned my wife, got an ambulance and transferred me to a hospital closest to my home.

The heroes of the day were Neil Rank, Xolisa Qhekeka and Nceba Tabasa. They secured my personal belongings and safeguarded my vehicle, until a friend collected it the next day.

I will thank them in person as soon as I have recovered fully.

But the story continues. I was transferred from Durbanville – to Panorama Mediclinic for a procedure on Monday July 1 and upon arrival I found a flower arrangement for me from V&A Waterfront Security. This was followed up with a personal visit by Deon Sloane (Senior Security Manager) to meet me and wish me a speedy recovery.

I have worked in many different countries and have met wonderful people along the way. I had to defend South Africa on many occasions regarding our violent crime culture and our previous political dispensation and I also started to doubt our society and the morals of my fellow South Africans.

But this incident has restored my pride and belief in my fellow South Africans. This is the country Nelson Mandela wished for:

I also need to thank my wife Benetta, friend Faffa Geldenhuys, ER 24, Dr Wouter Basson, Mediclinic staff and friends and family that supported me.

God Bless South Africa.

Hangberg Educational Trust Annual Dinner-Dance Suikerbossie Restaurant on Friday, 19 July 2013 from 7pm

Hangberg is situated on the idyllic slopes of Karbonkelberg and is home to the vibrant fishing community of Hout Bay. Sadly, it is plagued by the darker side of unemployment, substance abuse, prostitution, poaching and gangsterism, all leading to high teenage pregnancies, HIV/AIDS and low parental engagement. For more than 1,000 pre-school children in Hangberg, there are only 2 registered playschool facilities, with capacity for just over 200 children.

Hangberg Educational Trust (HET), established in May 2012, believes that the best way to break the cycle is by supporting pre-school children; showing them that their life-stories can be different.

HET's main focus therefore is the development and support of quality, registered pre-school infrastructure for 300 young children over the next 3 years. We currently also support ancillary activities such as training for pre-school teachers, IT classes for parents and youth football events.

To celebrate the ground work done over the last year, and to support our planned project for the next year, we invite you to our 2nd annual dinner-dance event on **Friday, 19 July 2013** at **Suikerbossie Restaurant, Hout Bay** from 7pm.
