This was an emotional story told by a composed and very brave young lady, who wanted to share per pain, joy and love with us. Kelly had hoped that her talk would help some of us to understand and accept all aspects of loss.

The evening was just a day after the seventh anniversary of the tragic passing of Ashley and this really made the occasion so poignant. Kelly had never stood up in public before to talk about her beloved sister Ashley, that could not have been easy and she spoke from her heart richly deserving the standing ovation given.

HBRC was one of Ashley's sponsors for her exchange with Japan and then the tragedy of her death, the story of the Memorial Fund, the Matching grant and Rotary's assistance to do nothing less than to fulfil her dream, the establishment of a centre for raped and abused children.

Perhaps we as Rotarians have achieved a little more than we thought and we have helped Kelly and her parents indirectly by our participation in the Nonceba Centre programme. There is a warm feeling that our actions have helped because we followed the principles of our organisation, Rotary International. Past District Governor Rodney Mazinter, who chaired the Ashley Memorial Fund, in thanking Kelly spoke of our, that is Rotarians, admiration for Kelly and for her courage in standing and speaking about Ashley in such a beautiful way.

It was a real pleasure to welcome Kelly's parents, Megan and Jeffrey, her boy friend Pailo and his family together with a generous sprinkling of our ladies, which is always greatly appreciated. It was a good evening of Rotary Hout Bay.

How useful that the following day was a public holiday celebrating Human Rights Day but sadly also a day of demonstrations in Hangberg. The preceding weeks have been a test on our stamina as Rotarians, the Argus, James House – which from all reports was a huge success, the Bowls Day which while testing was also a fun day and still to come the runners participating in the Two Oceans marathon.

MEMBERSHIP OF HBRC.


