#### **CLUB NOTES:**

- ➤ President Barry welcomed us all to 2012 and mentioned that Fran Mecham, Alan Lean and Arthur Nixon were all home from hospital and recovering. It was good to see both Alan and Fran with us at tonight's meeting.
- > Reminder that the Peace Meeting is on Sunday, 19<sup>th</sup> February.
- The Film Night on 22<sup>nd</sup> February, 2012, to raise funds for Polio Plus, will be showing "The Best Exotic Marigold Hotel" starring Judi Dench, Maggie Smith, Bill Nighy, Dev Patel & Tom Wilkinson. British Retirees travel to India to take up residence in what they believe is a newly restored hotel. Less luxurious than its advertisements the Marigold Hotel nevertheless slowly begins to charm in unexpected ways.

**International Toast**: The International Toast this week was proposed by Tony Hutchinson to the Rotary Club of Apia, Samoa of District 9920. District 9920 is made up of America Samoa, Cook Islands, Fiji, French Polynesia, Kiribati, part of New Zealand, Tonga and Samoa. All in all there are 48 clubs which boast 1762 members. The Rotary Club of Apia was chartered in 1970 and meets at 12 noon on a Tuesday at the Millennia Hotel. Two important events have taken place in Samoa since 2008:

- 1. On 7<sup>th</sup> September, 2009, Samoa became the first country since the 1970s to change the side of the road on which cars are driven. The Samoan Government introduced the change to end its reliance on expensive left-hand drive imports from America.
- 2. On 29 December, 2011, the Samoan Islands west of the International Date Line shifted back to west of the date line by skipping Friday 30<sup>th</sup> December. The International Date Line now passes between Samoa and American Samoa which remains aligned to the American date. This was done because Australia and New Zealand are Samoa's biggest trading partners and Samoa has a large number of expats. Being 21 hours behind made business difficult as the weekends were on different days. This meant only four days of the week were shared work days.

**Sergeant at Arms:** Our Sergeant was Terry Mecham who entertained us with a number of jokes and bumper stickers. Examples of the bumper stickers are: "I don't suffer from insanity,

I enjoy every minute of it"; "Sometimes I wake up grumpy; other times I let him sleep", "I'm not a complete idiot, some parts are missing".

**Guest Speaker:** Mary Ann Kelly ably introduced our guest speaker, Melina Skidmore, who is the founder and CEO of "Angels for the Forgotten".

Melina spent her childhood suffering excessive chores, beatings and rejection from her mother. In her teen she was placed in the care of DoCs and in four and a half years was placed with several different foster parents. At the age of 16 she gained her pilot's licence and also won a scholarship to study in Japan. When she returned form Japan DoCs no longer catered for her so she had no option but a Women's Refuge. At the age of fourteen Melina had made up her mind to do something for others who were faced with her predicament. Hence the birth of "Angels for the Forgotten".

'Angels for the Forgotten" has three major projects: Crisis Care Package Service (CCP), Women in Need Gaining Strength (WINGS) and the latest one Boost for Youth.

The Crisis Care packages consist of a bag of essentials for any child going into care. The bags consist of toiletries, Teddy Bear or transitional item depending on the age of the child, basic stationery items-a simple note book, crayons or pencils or pens and items of clothing and toys that may be required by the child entering care. For teenagers the teddy bear is replaced by a useful mental health pack along with other articles appropriate to the age of the teenager.

WINGS Program aims to provide quality preloved and new items to young or at risk mothers to aid them in being prepared for the arrival of their child. Crisis Care kits are also offered to women who are in crisis and need help to ensure the well being of their child during the crisis and while the Mum is seeking further support and intervention.

The aim of the Boost for Youth program is to provide young Mums with a transition pack so that they can live independently. This provides basic groceries and home necessities such as pegs and toilet brushes. The aim is to teach these young people how to cook, clean and eat properly. It also aims to assist these young people in returning to school by providing uniforms, shoes and stationery items.

How can we help? Melina said that the best way we can help is financially and by donations.
