PROUD GRANDPARENTS: Laurie and Pat Fromholtz are swelled with pride with the achievement of their grandson Sean Smee, who ran 3rd in his age division (30-34) in a field of 75 pre-qualified competitors in the World Triathlon Titles in Beijing.

Sean, a couple of years ago, was one of two riders from Tasmania, who circumnavigated the Mediterranean Sea (13,000Ks) by bike, with funds raised going to the Fred Hollows Foundation.

Their daughter Gillian, some years ago, competed at World Levelin Ironman Titles in Hawaii and Madeira in the 45-49 age group. These days Gillian is still active in triathlon at age 56.

They also recently welcomed their 8th grandchild, a girl Eden Grace. They now have 5 boys and 3 girls.

GUEST SPEAKER: Our own member Alan Lean, as a Director (in charge of marketing) & Presenter, welcomed the gathered Club members and provided a summary & outline of the history & workings of the Community Radio Station. 2AAA FM broadcasts on 107.1 &107.9 from Wagga & by Relay Junee 97.9, Gundagai & Coolamon 99.1. (Or listen on line at www.2aaa.net. which boasts listeners all over the world, inc. China, Ireland and even Russia!)

Alan introduced **Michael Georgiou**, a Board member & Treasurer, **Carmen Moran** (Associate Dean of Arts at Charles Sturt University) a Board Member & Trainer of Presenters, **Pat Hall** also a

Board member & responsible for Social Activities, Music Resources & Building Maintenance, and **Adrian Sadler** who is the Sales Manager. Adrian has had experience in Commercial Radio as a presenter, working for a national broadcast monitoring service & as well as being a musician. Alan passed on apologies from **Michael McFeeters** who has been with the Station since its inception & is a Life Member; Michael owns MJM Solutions & is an Engineer & Electronics Specialist, **Dr Peter Keith** who is Vice Chairman and **Chris Jackson**, the Operations Manager.

The 30 Year Anniversary Celebrations were held on July 31st this year. The first Official Broadcast hit the airwaves on July 31st 1981 from premises in The Australian Arcade. The move to the current premises was made in November 1982. The building was constructed entirely by Volunteers and with bricks being salvaged from a Church.

The two Studios are considered to provide the best facilities of any Community Radio Broadcaster in Australia. Originally music was delivered via vinyl records & tape to tape & now has progressed from CDs to Computer with some 30,000 tracks available; this is now proceeding to 50 to 60,000 titles.

Market Surveys, & 2AAA's own Research, show that it is the second most listened to radio station in Wagga.

New presenters are welcomed & undergo training programs, which include method & policy & procedures. Training sessions are held on Monday evenings over 3 hours & include homework. Presenters need special skills due to responsibility for accuracy. Many presenters have moved on to commercial broadcasting. The Station is on air for 24 hours seven days a week.

A Program Committee meets on a monthly basis to review programs and ensure that the music relates to the Formats. "Promotion" is limited to 5 minutes in each hour and any advertisement must be tagged with the Sponsor. Sponsorship is the Lifeblood of Community Radio as there is little Government funding now.

2AAA FM has emergency power backup in the event of an electricity failure and provides emergency information (such as during Wagga's December flooding).

2AAA FM has a membership of over 150 of which over 50 are 'on air' Presenters. Feedback from listeners is important to the successful operation of the Station. Membership has an initial fee of \$25 & thereafter \$15 per annum. Members receive regular newsletters, provide feedback & participate in the Management at meetings & the AGM.

There is a payment of approximately \$6000 each year to APRA, which is paid to the composers of songs in proportion to the number of times their title is played. The Presenter logs the necessary information. There must be a minimum of 20% Australian content.

Outside Broadcasts require producers to support the Presenter & Technical support; members are called on for assistance.

Mike Murray proposed the Vote of Thanks for the highly informative talk which kept the audience attentive & provoked a multitude of questions
