President Barry Francis donates \$5,109 to a top cause

<u>GUEST SPEAKER:</u> Past District Governor, Fred Loneragan, gave Club members an outline of the challenges and joys involved in the climb of Mount Kilimanjaro by various District 9700 Rotarians and their supporters. It was clear that the climbers set out in tropical conditions - but those who reached the top, found themselves in icy, snowy conditions. Climbers, John Glassford and Fred Loneragan, reached a height of 3,380 metres (to the John Matte huts) while those who climbed to the highest point in Uganda, reached 5,109 metres (16,763 feet).

Of course, the objective of this whole exercise is to achieve Rotary goals. Proceeds are distributed to the following 4 programs. (1) Rotarians Fighting Aids (Kenya), (2) School of St Jude's (Tanzania), (3) Bishop Masereka's Medical Care Clinic (Uganda) and (4) Operation Medical Hope (South Africa).

John Glassford encouraged our Club to concentrate on one particular cause which involves the Coolamon Club. That cause is "Coolamon House" at Hout Bay, which concentrates on AIDS prevention and counselling. That need is great when we hear about the statistics and about dreadful human behaviour which continues to spread AIDS.

President Barry Francis then presented the "Team" with our Club's cheque in the amount of \$5,109 which was made payable to "Roadmaps"

This was a most informative session. The speakers were introduced by Graeme Callander and thanked by David Cannon.
