Our Visit To Erin Earth

The program commenced soon after 6 pm and was led by Sr Carmel Wallace, who gave members and guests a tour of Erin Earth. Set on a three quarter acre block off Kildare Avenue and bordering the train line, the Bush Garden mimics Willans Hill. Using native plants which need minimum watering, this beautiful development is the fruit of a 10 year passion and active co-operation between the Presentation Sisters, their enthusiastic helpers, the Wagga Wagga City Council and more recently, Wagga Tradies and the Men's Shed.

Our member Bryan Short played an important part in the early days. It was he who pointed out Mount Erin's water salinity problems, which in turn propelled the solution of the wise use of available water and recycling.

Erin Earth is a showpiece which is being utilised as a tool for the education of school

students. Co-operation with the Wagga City Council is ongoing, which benefits both organisations. It is an excellent example of what can be achieved when a love of gardening and determination to overcome obstacles come together.

Members were given an opportunity to ask questions. In answer to one question "Where do you think you will be in 5 years time?'Sr Carmel answered "I see a lot of hope!" Mike Murray used this answer as a cue to asking the next question, "Would that include being kind to Pommies?" Sr Carmel hesitated for a moment, looked directly at Mike and replied "I'm Irish!"

Sr Carmel was introduced by long time work associate and friend, David Payne, and was thanked by Graham Russell.
