<u>GUEST SPEAKER:</u> John Goldsworthy introduced **PDG Fred Loneragan**, who is heading to Uganda in November with John Glassford from Coolamon and a group of dedicated Rotarians to climb the Mountains of the Moon, a climb for the Orphans of Africa. They hope to commence the climb on December 1st, World Aids Day. Fred told us about RFFA is the first Rotarian Action Group in the world of sixteen RAGs which have now been formed. With a Swiss mountaineer to carry the RFFA Banner to the summit, 5109 metres high and a guide called Moses Kashumba, Fred is confident he and the other climbers will return to collect our pledged donations. Fred gave us the frightening statistics of what the AIDS epidemic is doing to the African people and their culture and that we must act before it is too late. The climbing team will be accompanied by the WAGS (Whisky and Gin Set) as their support crew.


