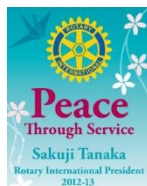

GUEST SPEAKER: Ellen Brasier introduced Patrick Byrnes who is a Year 12 Student at Kildare & was our nomination to attend the Honeywell Engineering Summer School. Patrick thanked the Club for the opportunity to attend & said that the initial activity was a number of “ice breaking” games which also provided nicknames by which they would identify each other, his was ‘Paddy-Wagon’. At 6.30 the following morning they were given an introduction by the Sub Dean and chose the section they wished to explore. He chose Aerospace & Mining - not because they are his primary interests but that he wanted to learn more about them. They then had a tour of Sydney University.

On Tuesday they visited Sydney Tech. & made radios and in the afternoon viewed a Nuclear Reactor in a safe & reinforced building seeing the Reactor Core through a camera. At dinner that night they had the opportunity to talk to a number of potential employers & gauge the available directions their studies might lead to. Wednesday saw them at Port Kembla Steel Works and then the University of Wollongong to be introduced to a wide range of scientific products. Thursday they travelled to the University of Western Sydney’s new Campus, & Engineering Workshops and then visited the RAAF Base. They had discussions of the various Scholarships available and were involved in the design of bridges with reference to stresses & loads.

Patrick won the Student of the Week award at the School. In reply to questions he said that he was aiming to attend either Sydney or the University of NSW & was working to achieve a mark in the 90’s. In the first year at University the Course is common to all students and then they branch off to the strand of their choosing. Patrick is considering a Scholarship with Defence where, among other considerations, after the first year there is a payment of \$40,000 a year.

David Friedlieb gave the vote of thanks & presented a Certificate stating that 10 Polio vaccinations would be paid for in recognition of the evening’s presentation.

- **THIRD.** The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;
- **FOURTH.** The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.
