SHORT AND SWEET: Tony Hutchinson's International Toast focused on the atomic bombings of the Japanese cities of Hiroshima (6 August 1945) and Nagasaki (9 August 1945) by the United States during the Second World War On the 15th August 1945, six days after the bombing of Nagasaki, Japan announced its surrender to the Allies. There are many Rotary Clubs in modern Japan and a toast was made to the Rotary Club of Hiroshima which meets at the Rihga Royal Hotel, Hiroshima on Thursdays at 12.30 pm.

BOARD REPORT: Secretary Peter Harding gave us a brief insight into the recent decisions of the Club's Board. The following items had been discussed at the July meeting:



- 1) The Board is examining the possibilities of taking on Corporate
- 2) The annual \$1,500 donation to CSU for a University student had been approved and paid.

- 5) Our club has prepared pamphlets to promote the six Wagga Rotary clubs;
- 6) The format of the International Toast document will be a postcard, not an A4 sheet;
- 7) Action is being taken on privacy issues regarding the publication of names and photos.

THE RAFFLE: Our Guest Speaker Genevieve Hunt drew the raffle and Ruth Barber was the winner of a bottle of wine.

SERGEANT AT ARMS: Bill Prest was our Sergeant at Arms for the night. Bill is always armed with a list of questions which he uses to help Treasurer Don Pembleton fill the coffers. Having dealt with Ruth Barber, he quickly moved to the "laid back" Graham Russell who, he asserted "takes valium as a stimulant". After fining the owners of dogs, Bill concentrated on whole tables of members and asked them questions on a variety of subjects with mixed success. By the way, the answer to the question "what was the place where the most gold was found in Australia's history?" was Hill End, near Bathurst (Terry Mecham). <u>GUEST SPEAKER:</u> Bill Prest introduced Genevieve Hunt (formerly Vineburg), who came to address the Club on the controversial subject of flood insurance. It was clear from Genevieve's presentation that the Company she represented had made substantial progress with providing flood insurance cover for some time. Also, it is clear that home owners wanting to take out this type of insurance cover in the future will need to be cautious and careful. There is no uniform approach to the provision of flood insurance at the present time, although there is a lot of pressure for Insurance Companies to move in that direction.

Genevieve intimated that the cost of this type of insurance for an average home owner would range between \$ 350 and \$ 400. In answer to a question by one of our members, she advised that home owners, who live above flood levels in postcode areas which also include flood prone areas, should point that out to their Insurance Company to make sure they are not paying for flood insurance they don't need.

That can easily happen in Wagga suburbs which all share the 2650 postcode!

Genevieve's presentation was very much appreciated by her audience. Don Pembleton gave the vote of thanks and led the acclamation.
