

#### **Brett Roelofs - RYLA**

#### Meeting 6<sup>th</sup> February, 2013

Brett Roelofs told us about his work as a PhD student, working with changes in vertebrates in the Canning Basin. What he is finding in this area is completely new and he has become the main researcher for the Canning Basin. Sharks and rays are the main focus of his PhD and he will be going to Morocco with Kate in March to present a paper at a conference put on by UNESCO.

Five areas in which Brett benefited from attending RYLA were:

- 1. Teamwork and participation within a team
- 2. Taking leadership roles

- 3. Facing challenges outside of comfort zones
- 4. Importance of networking
- 5. Already implementing some of the organisational skills learnt.

Team activities allowed people to take leadership roles. Good morale was experienced by all participants. A great deal of work went into planning the final night. It required skills learnt throughout the camp – teamwork, planning and a lot of communication and the event was successful.

Brett is implementing organisational skills and his diary has improved. He looks forward to implementing the things he has learnt at RYLA from here on in.

#### Insp Kim Travers and Commissioner Karl O'Callaghan RYDA

"On Friday the 2 DGs myself and David Pankhurst had a meeting with the RAC to seek partnership in doing Rotary WA young Drivers so that with the Police, we can run our own Young Drivers events and keep up to date with laws and how Driver education is being done worldwide. Today at the Presidents and AGs Lunch Phillip Skelton announced that we were in talks to go ahead and run our own as we felt RSE was not in touch with WA and the way the finances were done was not really the Rotary way.

As far as our own discussions go in Rotary, Clubs will now be able to ask for sponsorship for events at a Club level or State level, we don't need the expensive advertising or glossy manuals, we just need the basic materials with good facilitators and have room to change the content of sessions to match the area e.g. Kununurra will need slightly different points raised for safer Driving.

There is a lot of work to be done. Financially it would be ideal if all monies in surplus were either used for another School event that would run at a loss either with that Club or another one which is not as financial. This would enable us all to run more events and therefore potentially save more young lives which is what we are there for, especially in poorer areas.

#### **Update on Microscopes in Schools Project**

Activity continues to happen on this project. The estimated date of the next shipment remains 12<sup>th</sup> February, however, it often takes a further week before goods arrive in the STAWA warehouse.

A number of requests for sponsorship are out at clubs awaiting a response. The RC Nedlands has agreed to sponsor 20 units for Shenton College Deaf Education Unit and the RC Hillarys has agreed to sponsor 30 units to North Woodvale PS. The RC of Northam have a special presentation night organised on Monday, 25<sup>th</sup> February to present 120 microscopes to a further four Wheatbelt schools. Pres. Ken and Sec. Di will be attending the RC of Northam function on 25<sup>th</sup>.

A meeting has been organised for Wed. 13<sup>th</sup> March with ExxonMobil to seek funding for future purchases of units. This will be attended by WA Chief Scientist, Lyn Beazley, Pres. Ken, Sec. Di, our former member and scientist Carina Marshall and the Principal of Lesmurdie PS. Lyn believes that the perspective of a beneficiary of the microscopes (Lesmurdie PS) would be advantageous in the presentation to ExxonMobil. Our PN Kate Trinajstic will be in the UK at that time, hence Carina will carry the scientists role. Kate has put a PowerPoint presentation in place for the meeting.

Whilst in the UK, Kate will meet with our Agent General in London, Kevin Skipworth and the UK's Naked Scientist, Dr. Chris Smith, re expanding the project into the UK. Contact with Senior Rotarians in London has been made, and Kate will also meet with PDG Peter King and attend his Club.

An exciting project, thus far enabling in excess of 85,000 young students to be exposed to science from microscopes already in schools.

#### Polio Update

Pres. Ken advised that from 1<sup>st</sup> Jan to present, there has been zero cases of Polio reported in the world. The sad news however, is that two people in Pakistan delivering vaccine have been killed in the past week, bringing the total to 12 who have been killed delivering vaccine in recent times in Pakistan. There is a Hero's Fund which was set up by RI to assist the families of people killed whilst working to take the vaccine to the children.

Unfortunately, there has now been 1 case recorded in Pakistan and very, very sadly, 12 people have been killed (9 of them people who administer the vaccine) in the north of Nigeria, in Kano City. The Muslims believe that the vaccine is given to cause the children sterility. Hence the attack on the vaccination booths.
