Meeting 28th August 2013

DG Hank de Smit visited the Club this week. A Club Assembly began from 5pm, which was followed by our regular meeting.

DG Hank spoke firstly about the Foundation Goals of Rotary. This includes the eradication of Polio. The World Health Organisation has stated that Rotary could complete that this year. However, immunisation will need to continue. The Gates Foundation has announced that for every \$1 Rotary raises, they will match it with \$2.

Hank's goals for the district include strong membership and diversity, reflecting contemporary society. Woman only make up 14% or Rotary membership. While the older generation continue to play an important art in Rotary, Hank reiterated that we need to continue to attract younger members. We also need a more multicultural Rotary to reflect the multi-cultural society we live in.

The DG intends to start three new Roteract Clubs. New clubs create an increase in members. There needs to be continued support of Youth projects and using such projects and programs to encourage the youth to become Rotarians. In addition to this, DG Hank would also like to see increased involvement between the clubs in the District. This will create a strong, positive and contemporary image. As Rotary Clubs work together more, they will be seen as one, working towards the same end goal, while clubs will still remain autonomous.

DG Hank left us with some food for thought: At 108 years old, how relevant in Rotary today? Is the Rotary Club of Freshwater Bay still relevant?

Society continues to change around us. We must be careful not to become intoxicated by our success. As human beings, we can fall into habit – we must continue to keep our club relevant and not become obsessed with preservation.
