GUEST SPEAKER

Michele Sleep .

Michele gave us an in depth overview on the redevelopment of Wagga Base Hospital and said that the decision to redevelop onsite was the correct one .The area had a great diversity of Doctors in close proximity and she often saw Dr Gerrard Carroll walking from his rooms to the base to attend to an emergency, if the hospital was 10 minutes away a patient could be lost in an emergency. Calvary while close by has no emergency services and the base can attend to those patients in those circumstances.

The building of the Base will be completed in stages

1ST sage will be a \$90m redevelopment of the Mental Health Building, where there will be 50 beds, 30 Acute beds and 20 sub acute beds, currently there are only 18 acute beds for patients, the work will take approximately 12 months to complete.

The next work will be the completion of a brand new Emergency Dept, then a New Theatre Block with 6 theatre rooms and 2 procedure rooms

 2^{ND} Stage will be the Tower Block and a new Emergency Ward, the building will be 6 stories with a Helicopter Pad on top and a dedicated lift to the Pad, Michelle indicated the importance of this as .currently a sick child has to be transported from the Base to the showground, this time could be life threatening.

The building although only 6 stories high will be constructed so that it can be added onto in the future.

In 2014 The Tower block will be pulled down and replaced with a New one including a Pediatrics ward and she is currently preparing a new application for more funding for after 2014 to include a new rehabilitation and Geriatrics centre.

The new application is to include a new Community Centre and hopefully all of this will attract new Doctors and nurses to the Base, currently there are 42 permanent vacancies and 50 temporary vacancies for nurses.

There is an Urgent need for Specialists Nurses in the ICU and Theatre areas.

It is currently an ongoing struggle to maintain the services in the Emergency area due to this shortage .

Michelle did indicate that the shortage of Specialist Doctors and Nurses was both domestic and international.

Michelle was positive as to the outcome for the Base and the community.


