<u>GUEST SPEAKER:</u> Past District Governor **Fred Loneragan** introduced **Marissa Olsen**, a member of a long-standing Wagga family and a charter member of Murrumbidgee Rotary Club. Marissa is a nutritionist and dietician, who had been asked to speak to the Club about food labels.

This was an extremely interesting and informative talk about the real meanings of the information for consumers which is printed on food packaging. This was summarised well into Marissa's 10 tips, as follows:

- Read the nutrition information panel and the ingredient list.
- Compare and contrast different brands.
- Allergens must be declared.
- Sugar includes all carbohydrates and depends on the type of sugar, eg. fruit sugar and milk sugar is good.
- Claims 'light' and 'lo-fat', should be studied carefully to determine the actual type of fat
- Laws governing substances added to packaged food
- Cholesterol
- Toasted or oven-baked can be coated with oil or juice
- Diet products are reasonable, but fat content needs to checked
- more natural foods are best and use processed foods sparingly.

**Sue McAlpin** thanked Marissa by saying that she is a great example of a young person who was educated locally and returned to the community, following further studies, a motivated professional. As Sunrise Rotary has focused on diabetes, nutrition is a pertinent topic.

Your bulletin reporter notes further benefits of eating fresh foods, following our recent visit to Kurrajong-Recycling: how much less rubbish would be generated should we consume less processed, and therefore packaged, foods.
