GUEST SPEAKER - INSURANCE AND WHERE DOES IT FIT INTO OUR LIVES.

Peter commenced with a history of insurance and its development and effect on our lives and its place in business.

The first methods of transferring or distributing risk were practiced by the Chinese and Babylonian traders as long ago as the 3rd and 2nd millennia BC

Peter explained that Lloyds of London is not an insurance co, it is a market and commenced in a coffee shop by Edward Lloyd, a popular place for merchants to meet for shipping news and commenced primarily as Marine Ins. In 1691 they moved to larger premises and in 1713 when Edward passed away his son took over the business.

The business changed in 1771 when merchants and ship owners put up 100 pound each and basically formed a co.op and today Lloyds of London remains the leading market for marine and other specialist types of insurance , but it works rather differently than the more familiar kinds of insurance.

Insurance of today can be traced to the Great Fire of London, which 1666 devoured 13,200 houses. In the aftermarth of this disaster, Nicholas Barbon an opened up an office to insure buildings. In 1680, he established Englands first fire insurance company. THE FIRE OFFICE to insure brick and frame homes .In the late 19th century, accident insurance began to be available ,which operated much like modern disability insurance.

Cuthbert Heath started at Lloyds in 1859 on 100 pounds a year and by 21 he had become an underwriting member and is recognised as being the father of non-marine insurance, creating the first burglary, earthquake and hurricane policies

Lloyds was backed by rich individuals with all of their private wealth since 1994 Lloyd,s has allowed corporate members into the market. The losses in the early 1990,s devastated many Names with 1500 out of 34000 Names being declared bankrupt.

Peter began work in insurance on the 17th Dec 1966, worked with the Co from 1970-1972 in PNG, came back to Wagga and worked with QBE until 1982 when he resigned and started Peter Brown and Assoc in Wagga, he was the State Brokers Rep for the District for 18yrs and currently is working on the correct wording for insurance on the redevelopment of the MILL

Peter spoke proudly of his and his families achievements in building up the name of Peter Brown and Assoc in the Riverina and their recognition within the Insurance Industry in Australia.

Darren Verus thanked Peter for his speech.

An Email from David:

Just a note to let you, and my friends at Sunrise, know I'm OK. I'm just past the half-way point and will be soon back in Wagga - I know only too well that it will seem as if I've never been, though the memories and pics will help it stay in my mind.

The Japan Writers Conference I attended was fine (one speaker was the Indian novelist whoi wrote the book on which the film Slumdog Millionaire was based). My own editing workshop went well and was appreciated - there were seven in the group: such a mixture of talented, insightful and varied poems.

Because I was asked, I have given an 'encouraging' speech at Sendai Toastmasters - after the earthquake and tsunami in March. Some of the Toastmasters took me on a drive to the areas around Sendai port and to the north where the brunt of the tsunami hit. I had a palpable sense of emptiness - reinforced by the grey day, the grey concrete house and building foundations remaining after their 'charges' had been wrenched away. I've drafted a poem - will work on it. Maybe I can speak at the Club one morning when I'm back. I'd like to say I have some vivid pics but my phone camera just doesn't do the devastation with sufficient gravity.

I've met up with many friends (I'll catch up with John Morris on Saturday), eaten some fantastic, exotic food (eg pig intestine and horse sashimi), given radio interviews for a bi-lingual cultural program, and spoken about Australia to an adult language and culture group, using a power point presentation in which I announced Dame Edna Everage (born in Wagga) was the Queen of Australia!

I hope you are all well and thriving! See you soon,
