#### **GUEST SPEAKER:** Lauren Slater, Rotary Youth Leadership Award

**David Gilbey** introduced Lauren: a 4<sup>th</sup> year Pharmacy Student at CSU who recently attended Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) at Parkes.

**Lauren** stated that the RYLA week was the most memorable week of her life this year: she arrived at MAMRE Farm, Alectown, near Parkes and was welcomed with mud and slush and a big tin shed. The entry was a little wet and cold, the friendship was very warm and on her arrival there were nineteen participants, six leaders as well as a camp Mum & Dad.

As the week started to unfold it was quite evident that it would be filled with new and exciting experiences, team building and personal growth. There were many great speakers the best being Charles Tarby the founder of Century 21 real-estate: his address was inspiring and had you believe at the finish that you 'Can do anything you want' – just try and apply yourself.

There were many other topics discussed over the week including Rotary Australia World Community Service (RAWCS) and how we can all make a difference. Risk management was perhaps a little harder to sell to a group of young people; however the message was understood and valued

'Making the most of the media' was great: '.... it gave us an opportunity to speak in a structured situation and we all went very well and valued the opportunity. The mandatory screening of the movie *The Dish* was an experience, especially as the very next day, when we drove the 16 kms to the Dish, we had a unique opportunity to explore the Dish inside and out. Our risk management came to the fore when the dish started moving whilst we were on it. The walk back to Mamre Farm was great (Not Really) over ploughed paddocks, after rain lunch in the middle of a paddock would not normally be a highlight except when you were as hungry as we were. There were check points, group exercises and motivation that kept us all going. As we got closer to home base there was a three-way race on to be first over the fence – we all agreed that it was a dead heat.' There were many other activities that Lauren told us of, far too lengthy to report. The RYLA anthem is always a highlight at the camp and Lauren felt that they 'done it proud' after much practice. Another serious topic was Mental Health: ideas on how to recognise the symptoms and how to help.

After camp cleanup and goodbyes to Rotarians and camp leaders they finished up at Pizza Hut for three hours – it was quite evident that no-one really wanted to go home. 'Thank you Rotary for

opening my eyes a little wider to the world.' Lauren has been asked to be a speaker at the DISCON in Orange next year: a great honour.

**Len Wade** thanked Lauren on behalf of the Club and complimented her on her delivery and insight into another exciting Rotary programme.
