Guest Speaker: John Roberson Solomon Islands Trip

Solomon Islands is a sovereign state in Oceania, east of <u>Papua New Guinea</u>, consisting of nearly one thousand islands. It covers a land mass of 28,400 square kilometres (10,965 square miles). The capital, <u>Honiara</u>, is located on the island of <u>Guadalcanal</u>. The nation of the Solomon Islands is a member of the <u>Commonwealth of Nations</u>.

The Solomon Islands are believed to have been inhabited by <u>Melanesian</u> people for many thousands of years. Spanish navigator <u>Alvaro de Mendaña</u> was the first European to arrive in Solomon islands in 1568 and named them *Islas Salomon*. The United Kingdom established a protectorate over the Solomon Islands in 1893. In the Second World War there was fierce fighting between the Americans and the Japanese in the <u>Solomon Islands campaign</u> of 1942–45, including the <u>Battle of Guadalcanal</u>.

Self-government was achieved in 1976 and independence two years later. The Solomon Islands is a <u>constitutional monarchy</u> with the <u>Queen of the Solomon Islands</u>, at present <u>Elizabeth II</u>, as the <u>head of state</u>. <u>Danny Philip</u> is the tenth and current <u>Prime Minister of the Solomon Islands</u>. He was elected on August 2010.
