PROGRAM OMNI - OLDER MEN NEW IDEAS

PDG Ray King screened a presentation about OMNI - Older Men New Ideas for members.



OMNI is a group for older men who get together to enjoy companionship and to share stimulating discussion about topics of interest.

It gives these men the opportunity to share the highlights of their lives and their problems including those encountered as they age (like fine wine). As well as getting together, it provides them with support and develops a sense of trust while enjoying each other's company. By listening to others and sharing their circumstances, members feel empowered or as if they have greater control of their daily lives.

Some of the organisation's members have been referred to the group by medical practitioners, wives or family members.

In 2002, Kooringal Rotary formed the first OMNI group in Wagga. There are now four such groups in the city; the most recent being the OMNI group at the RSL Remembrance Village which is 16 weeks old.

PROGRAM WORKING with CHILDREN CHECK

Club Youth Protection Officer, Dennis Bishop gave a presentation to members encouraging them to complete their check on-line.

The club is required to maintain a record of each member's accreditation number and the date of its expiry.



Any person over the age of 18 years who has interaction with young people is required to have this check.

Method 1 Members were advised that the check could be completed on-line at www.kids.nsw.gov.au by following the prompts using the exact details on their driver's licence and then visiting Services NSW (formerly RTA) in Fox Street with a printed copy of the details. Once processing is completed, members will be issued with a number and the expiry date of the check. A copy of this needs to be given to the club's Youth Protection Officer.

<u>Method 2</u> For members without access to a computer, please phone 02 9286 7219 with your licence handy. The customer service operator will complete the form on your behalf and then provide your application number to be taken to Service NSW to complete the rest of the process.

A handout was given to members to take home to assist them to complete their application.


