- Lunar New Year lasts 15 days. It is a season of superstitions.
- On the first day, you can live like a college student no showers, laundry or cleaning and especially no taking out the garbage as it is said you wash away your luck and prosperity.
- You hang out with family especially the in-laws on the second day.
- For those singles who dread interrogation about settling down, there is now a solution –
  boyfriend rentals The package comes with "a free embrace, hand holding and a goodbye
  kiss on the cheek," as well as a list of additional specific service charges.
- Fireworks are used to drive away evil.
- Red envelopes with money are given to young children to keep the children healthy and long living.
