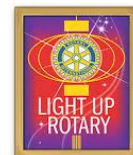

Inner Wheel is an association of clubs with membership drawn from women related to a Rotarian, former Rotarian or an Inner Wheel member. **The Inner Wheel Changeover Dinner took place on Wednesday 9 July, 2014.** As a number of members are partners of Inner Wheel members, attendance at this week's meeting was reduced owing to their commitment to attend the Inner Wheel Changeover.

Inner Wheel members across Australia are celebrating the success of their national cord blood research project, fundraising for which has now exceeded \$ 2 million.



Blood from the umbilical cord was traditionally discarded after birth. It can now be used to save lives and is being successfully used to replace bone marrow transplants in the treatment of leukaemia.

Funds from the cord blood research project have enabled Inner Wheel Australia to award 35 research grants to scientists. These grants have also allowed investigations to continue in the use of cord blood for the treatment of cystic fibrosis, cerebral palsy and heart disease.
