So You Want To Be An Author, Eh!

Chris Cunniffe introduced **Michael Green**, a former British merchant seaman and founder of two IT recruitment companies, and now a successful author.


Michael outlined his literary career, starting with his critical appraisal of the articles in "Playboy". Moving right along, he charted his course of early writings and the hurdles of dealing with book publishers.

Quoting from Carol Blake's "From Pitch to Publication", he noted that of 12.000 unsolicited manuscripts she receives annually, only 2 or 3 get published.

In the mid eighties, he wrote "Big Aggie Sails the Gulf". No New Zealand Publisher was interested, so he published it himself, but the market was too small.

Six years ago his travels were interrupted by the SARS outbreak, so using that as his theme, he wrote "The Crucial Gene". This sold well, even in Germany, and Random House took it on under a new title, "Blood Line". This book, and subsequent titles in a trilogy, have fund-raised for Lifeline. Michael briefly outlined his personal experiences of losing an aunt, a son and a boss to suicide, and hence his support of that organisation.

He then embraced the modern phenomena of Amazon, e-reader Kindles, printing your own book on demand, or selling through on-line stores. Whilst he will do e-books, print and talking books, there is nothing like the real thing – the smell and feel of a book; something that can be gift wrapped, sit on the coffee table etc..



In conclusion he read a "teaser" from "Blood Line" and invited us to buy the book to find out what happened next.

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Three Minute Talk

Merv Tait recounted highlights from his recent visit to Dubai – the biggest and the best of everything. Many of us have had the pleasure of visiting that City, but everything moves so fast that much of his presentation was new news. Terminal 3 under construction will be the largest building in the world, and will enable the Airport to process 90 million passengers annually – currently 47 million. 566 hotels offer 67,000 rooms – there are currently 33.000 new rooms under construction. The Burj El Arab, and Burj Khalifa feature the highest Atrium, the fastest elevator, and of course the world's highest building. Nearby Dubai Mall has the largest plate glass window – this is one wall of the Aquarium feature. Contrary to common perception, oil and petroleum only account for 6% of GDP. The development of Port Jebel Ali will see this as the world's biggest by 2030 - mind boggling.
