

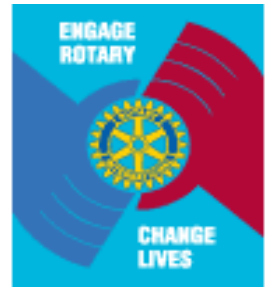

Meeting 6th November, 2013

Speaker this week was our member Max Hipkins, who is the Mayor of the City of Nedlands and a Town Planner by profession.

Max gave a very open and honest account of his journey in local government, from becoming elected in 2008, what he found as a member of Council, how he became Deputy Mayor in 2009 and then Mayor in 2011. As Mayor, Max set about making a positive difference. Some senior staff were replaced, communications were improved and personal priorities

have been implemented – such as arts, recognition of worthy causes, protection of living environment and water resources. Max supports residents where possible, he has made an effort to settle long standing disputes such as Swanbourne and Sunset Hospitals, Regis Aged Care, NAPHT constitution, parking problems, review of Standing Orders, review of aging infrastructure and Adams Road.

Current issues still on the agenda are DAPs growing State interference, underground power, Sunset Hospital, heritage inventory, pesticides, new town planning scheme and amalgamations.

The City of Nedlands has 20,000 residents and 150 staff in four departments. Max had a consultancy business when elected as Mayor, however, with the demands of the position, he now devotes himself full time to the job.

Many thanks Max, we're fortunate to have you both as a valued member of the Club and as Mayor of the City of Nedlands.

Just over a month ago the RCFB received a cheque for \$1,500 from a District Simplified Grant for this project. A further \$500 has been ratified by the Rotary Club of Freshwater Bay, Charity Fund, Inc. Gift Fund account to also go towards this project. The remaining \$1,000 will come from Club funds. As with last year, the ESL books will be split between schools in low socio- economic areas and refugee families.

A Paint Your Pinkie was carried out at Moerlina School last Monday afternoon. Notification only went to the parents Friday last week hence not many children brought in their gold coins. Pinkies were painted and PRID Ken has collected more coins from the school which have come in.

Potential Rotary Foundation Global Grant

A global grant to repair classrooms in a school in Madurai, India, is being investigated. Dir. Rajah is sourcing another Rotary Club to join with the RCFB to enable adequate funding for the project.

Microscopes

In recent weeks 490 units, which totals 11 Rotary Clubs, plus a further order from Watercorp equating to 17 schools have been invoiced. Several have paid and collected microscopes, others are ready for collection, once payment has been received. Some country schools are very small, hence a reduced number have been ordered for these schools.

A few metropolitan Rotary Clubs have generously decided to sponsor country schools who don't have a nearby Rotary Club. One such example which has come in this week is the RC of Melville who are sponsoring units to Hyden PS.

Requests from Schools or enquiries from clubs have a further 325 units awaiting the go ahead. This involves 9 Rotary Clubs and 11 schools. With the school year rapidly racing by, it is hoped that all these requests / inquiries will be brought to fruition in the coming month.

Camp Opportunity

An update on the article in the Bulletin from last week. Shenton College Deaf Education Centre had a deaf student who is in a wheelchair who was keen to attend Camp Opportunity. The school was in the process of organising a 'Buddy' to attend with him who 'signs', hence the RCFB would sponsor both the 'Camper' and 'Buddy' to Camp Opportunity. Unfortunately, despite information to the contrary a week ago, when

confirming the attendance of these two young fellows, the Club was informed that the Camp is now full.

RYLA

On the positive side, this now allows the RCFB to sponsor an applicant for the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards Camp. Despite contacting a number of potential attendees, the Club has been unable to identify anyone to attend RYLA this January. The District Committee has a number of applicants without sponsors and has provided us with an applicant, a female named Amy Sleight from Mosman Park. Dir. Liz will follow through on Amy and organise payment for the camp.

Condolences

Condolences are extended to Tr. John and Jen Duff on the passing of John's father. Our thoughts are with the Duff family at this difficult time.

This now totals three of our member's fathers who have recently passed on. All men were a good age and had obviously lived full and productive lives. Jenny Day's father was a Charter member of the RC of Gosnells and John's father had also been a Rotarian in country Victoria.

The RC of Nedlands has lost four of their members in the past week, with PDG Eli Quartermaine dying midyear. The members from the RC of Nedlands have given a vast number of years service to mankind

through Rotary. PP John Grosser, a Rotarian for 56 years had been a member of the RC of Cottesloe prior to becoming a Charter member of the RC of Nedlands,. PDG Axel Handevitt-Haar had been a member in Denmark before migrating to Australia 27 years ago. Their other members had also been very long term Rotarians, with the exception of PDG Eli Quartermaine, who joined Rotary in the late 1990s.

Axel was a keen supporter of the RCFB, reading our bulletin each week and attending our special events. He was even planning to attend the concert again this weekend. (see photo from last year's concert)

Satellite Clubs

The 2013 Council on Legislation enabled establishment of Satellite Clubs, which are quite separate to those established under the Satellite Pilot Program (which is still running).

The new satellite club policy provides for a new way to create Rotary Clubs, being a short-term transitional step on the path to becoming a full, independent Rotary Club.

It is anticipated that the Satellite Club Application Forms will soon be available. The good news is that there will be no minimum number of members required to establish these clubs.

Satellite clubs will have a name that reflects the name of its sponsor club e.g. Rotary Satellite Club of Bangkok North, Evening, Thailand.

Satellite clubs can be an e-club, but the intention is that at some point in the future the Satellite Club will be able to charter as a Rotary Club in its own right rather than staying a permanent section of the sponsoring club. The Satellite members are Rotarians and pay the usual Rotary dues.
