






AWARENESS CAMBODIA

WA dentist, Dr Gary Hewett OAM and his wife Kim have spent the last 19 years rebuilding the lives of the children of Cambodia through their NGO Awareness Cambodia. It directly assists some of the most underprivileged children in Cambodia.

Haven taken children off the streets who suffer from Aids, are orphans or being 'trafficked', since 1995, some of the children have gone from Sunshine House (the orphanage for babies through to end of primary school), to House of Progress (home for high school students) many are now at university. With this final step before leaving the protective and loving environment of Awareness Cambodia, a new facility to house them— Graduation House — was officially opened in Phnom Penh on 7th and 8th September.

The school must be sponsored by a Rotary Club within District 9455.

It is recommended that Club Heats be conducted during the week commencing 13th October 2014 but definitely no later than Friday 14th November 2014.

Semi-Finals will be held in February 2015.

The District Final will be held on Friday 27th March 2015.

The W.A State Final will be held in May 2015.

Topic

Each participant may choose their own topic, but the principles of the Rotary Four Way Test must be addressed & referred to in the speech:

Of the things we think, say or do

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

The duration of the speech should be six (6) minutes.
