

MICROSCOPES FOR BUNBURY SCHOOLS

A hugely successful event hosted by Bunbury Cathedral Grammar took place on Wednesday, 23rd July, where 12 schools in Bunbury received sets of microscopes funded by a grant from Alinta Energy.

Former WA Chief Scientist Lyn Beazley was a standout, presenting another of her informative and inspirational addresses to the teachers who attended from 10 of the 12 schools. Sec. Di followed Prof. Beazley with the background on the project, where it is at now plus information on the website. Ben Meakins, a Representative from Alinta said a few words about Alinta's involvement and then went on to present sets of microscopes to representatives from each of the schools.

Prof. Beazley said she must be getting 'soft' as she became very emotional during the presentations as each person receiving units on behalf of the schools spent 1-2 minutes expressing the benefits the units will be to their school and students. Lyn commented that she'd love to have had it recorded.

For student involvement, head boy, Harrison and head girl Felicity participated in the event, which was followed by a light lunch.

The Alinta PR machine spring into gear as there was a press release on Monday from Alinta, articles in newspapers and an interview and coverage of the project on radio programs, including a live to air interview of PP Di by the ABC South West.

MP John Castrilli, whose PA Taryn made the initial contact with the Bunbury schools for PP Di, emailed to say that John will be writing about the project in his column which goes into the Bunbury Mail newspaper on Wednesday and will also include a photo in his newsletter which will be published in the Bunbury Herald in August. A number of principals stated that they would be placing information and photos in their school newsletters.

Former RCFB member John Duff's son Ben is Vice Principal of BCG and was PP Di's contact who organised for the school to host the event. All in all the whole exercise was a standout success, bringing great credit and publicity to the RCFB.

Camp Opportunity

Camp Opportunity is a live-in camp for 18 to 35 year old young adults with disabilities, "Campers", who are teamed with an able bodied "Buddy" for a week of fun, adventure, double participation and reward. And while the Campers have a fun week at Camp Opportunity their parents or carers also enjoy a free week at home.

The aim of the Camp is for participants to develop personal growth through relationship and teamwork skills. Rotary sponsorship covers all costs to "Campers" and "Buddies". It is run by a District committee and has a Rotary nurse on site all week.

Where is Camp Opportunity?

Held at the Point Walter Recreation Centre, 1 Stock Road, Bicton, which is a dormitory style camp with individual four person rooms which has its own bathroom and toilet suitable for people with disabilities.

When is Camp Opportunity? Sunday 25 January to Saturday 31 January 2015

Activities include Archery, Abseiling, Flying Fox, Ten Pin Bowling, Adventure World, Zoo Visit, T-shirt screen printing, Water sports {biscuit and boat rides}, Disco & Karaoke Night, Kite making, Origami, Camper and Buddy Talent Night, lots of swimming, games and laughter.

Nominations for Campers and Buddies close on 31st October 2014


What can our Club do?
