Program: Fredon's new plant is located on Tyler Boulevard, between Hopkins and Heisley Rd. When the sign announcing "Fredon" is first seen, one can barely see the building, which is located some distance off the boulevard, reached by a wide and winding driveway. All in all, an impressive first impression for the visitor.

Roger advised us that he formed the company 44 years ago and now, after moving in to these new premises he was retiring as president and turning the reins over to Alyson. After warning his audience to turn off our cell phones he promptly sat down, leaving newly crowned Alyson to make the presentation.

Formed in 1969, Fredon is a precision machining and grinding company, with FAA certification. They specialize in complicated, difficult to machine, projects and fully 40% of their employees have been with them for more than 10 years.

More than three quarters of their business is generated by the aerospace, transportation and defense industries. This new state of the art facility, with 70,000 square feet of manufacturing space, is 47% larger than the one they left behind, and situated on 10 acres. Thus, they are primed for as much as 30,000 feet expansion.

As part of their commitment to their industry and the community, some years ago they worked with Lakeland College to begin a degree program in manufacturing, the Associates Degree in Advanced Manufacturing. More of this community involvement is found in their support for the Alliance for Working Together, or AWT, since its beginning.. As part of their AWT involvement they have sponsored a RoboBots competition with local high schools since 2010. These



good works will continue and no doubt be expanded in coming years. Following this formal presentation, guides were available for a tour of the facilities.
