

The board has elected to donate \$750 of club foundation funds to Learning About Business, one of the educational gems in Lake County.

LAB has never accepted any government funding.

At Lake Erie College on Sunday, June 16, LAB begins its 34th annual week-long free-market competition. A select contingent of 65 bright, eager area high school sophomores and juniors will begin a dynamic, interactive, entrepreneurship adventure. Students will compete in virtual companies operating in a sophisticated market simulation.
