

LAST MEETING Reported by Linda Clements

The meeting was called to order by President Wayne. The Invocation was given by Amy Kapostasy who gave thanks for the blessing of Rotary. A lovely dinner was served.

Master of Ceremonies, Dr. Gary Estadt, opened the program and thanked everyone involved for the wonderful meal. He introduced the special guests that were present this evening: Wade Obde, Thomas, Diane and Becca Steele who is back from Korea, Tom Petro and his wife Sylvia, Ed and Dawn Byler, in-laws of Tom Hough, Rich Kotila and Richard Mole of the Andover Rotary, and Dee Fuldauer was not able to be present. Past Presidents were asked to stand and be recognized.

Rick Cooper was then asked to present the District Awards. Governor Steve told Rick that he is proud of the accomplishments of our Club. We are the 5th highest in support of the annual foundation in our district out of 57 clubs with \$180 per capita. We finished second, only to the Cleveland Club, in total contributions. We did reach "Every Rotarian Every Year" status which is a huge honor.

Dr. Gary Estadt presented the Rotarian of the Year Award. Last year's recipient, Dave Noble, could not be present so the immediate past winner, Ted Hieronymus, presented the award which has been re-named the Fred Fuldauer Rotarian of the Year Award in honor of Fred, a long-time Secretary of this club, who passed away in 2004. The award this year was presented to a very deserving 24 year veteran of the Mentor Rotary who is dedicated to the small businesses of Mentor, Roger Sustar. Pres. Wayne presented some additional awards to members. John Wilson was presented with a pin. John has joined the club and was previously a very active member of the Hillcrest Club for 35 years. He thanked the Club for his warm welcome and hopes to spend the next 35 years here. Tom Preto was named "Honorary Rotarian for 2012-2013 for his unselfish sacrifice and dedication to our bone marrow program. Special Paul Harris Fellow Awards were presented to Wade Obde, Curt Jones, Vickie Wildeman and Kevin Newcomb. Fred Lariccia was recognized as our special district honoree.
