Joe had a team leading 23 home runs, 87 runs batted in, and a .289 batting average earning him the 1980 American League Rookie of the Year award. He has had a book written about him, along with a song "Go Joe Charboneau" which was a big hit on the local charts.

In a 1981 spring training game, he suffered a back injury from which he never fully recovered. It led to him being released from the Indians in 1983.

Although Joe has been through a number of other injuries, he was still able to get a hit in professional baseball in four decades--70s, 80s, 90s, and 00s. Along with doing clinics and lessons, Joe has been a minor-league hitting coach for the past eight years.

Although "Super Joe" declared that he was not a good speaker, nor used to speaking before such large groups, he provided a VERY entertaining overview of his background, his experiences as a player, the changes (technology, etc) that the game of baseball has undergone in the past decades, and his current

endeavors as a businessman and coach.

Super Joe shared stories of his Indians and other AL colleagues, player superstitions, the Fantasy Baseball Camp at Classic stadium and which Rotarian is now to be known as having the "best backward throwing arm"?

The audience's Tribe Fever was clearly evident in their rousing applause, and many questions for Super Joe!
