Program: Past Mentor Rotarian, Dr. Scott Nelson

Since retiring and moving back to Colorado, Ex-Mentor Rotarian Scott has remained quite busy. Among other things, he has joined a Rotary club in Boulder and is very much involved in helping a hospital in Cameroon, West Africa set up a ENT program. He brought us a power point presentation to bring us up to date with this project.

Cameroon was a German colony before WW I, and was split up between France and Britain after that war. (To the victors go the spoils). The two colonies gained their Independence and were reunited in the early sixties. Since they managed this transition without a civil war, the infrastructure of the country is in relatively good shape, for Africa.

During their occupation, the Europeans started many mission hospitals. While there is government health care, it is embryonic and the government has allowed those mission hospitals to continue. It is in one of those hospitals that Scott is directing his efforts.

The Mbingo Baptist Hospital was started in 1952 as a leper colony by Dieter Lemke, MD, a German-Canadian missionary doctor. There followed a gradual increase in the number of doctors serving the hospital, especially African doctors. These doctors brought new skills to the site, allowing the hospital to expand its services beyond Leprosy.

By 2009, when Scott began to be involved, the specialties available at Mbingo included Internal Medicine, General Surgery, OB/Gyn, Dental, Leprosy Care, Aids Care and Ophthalmology, but still no ENT. At the time there were five million people living in the area the hospital served.

Dr. Acha Tikum was a Cameroonian-born general medical practitioner at MBH who saw a need for ENT service. He traveled to Nairobi for an ENT residency and returned to MBH in mid-2010 to found the ENT department.

Scott was later introduced to Dr Acha by Drs. Tom and Edie Welty, long-time friends of his. His twenty-five years in ENT practice in Mentor, and his current retirement with his practice limited to service work, made him a natural to help Dr. Acha expand the ENT department at MBH

Currently, the Rotary Project at MBH is to adequately equip the new ENT service, to put the MBH ENT doctors in touch with American ENT doctors and to add to the skills of the ENT doctors at Mbingo. Our Rotary club as well as a Rotary club in Colorado and one in Cameroon are combining to work toward these *goals*. Dr. Scott Nelson hopes to return to Mbingo soon with more that \$40,000 of ENT tools for MBH, paid for by the three clubs and Rotary International Foundation.
