Renee is a 2003 graduate of The Ohio State University. She is the Director of Marketing and Business Development for the Great Lakes Mall which is part of Simon Property Group, Inc. She did a very interesting "walk down memory lane" of the mall then and now.

There is a huge renovation taking place that should be completed in November (hopefully by Black Friday). There will be new tenants coming within the next few years. There will be a new food court, new concourses with new, slim columns for easier viewing. There will also be new tile and carpet in the middle of the concourse.

They will be adding 5 large soft seating areas. (Those tired husbands will be able to rest while the women shop, shop shop.) All of the entrances will include stacked stone and new logos.

Marketing for the Mall is unique as she has 125 tenants and has to drive people to the Mall. Simon will focus on media as on-line, social and digital and will have an IPhone APP. Their Facebook page is growing. There are 3360 "likes" this year. It is a great tool. They are also using Twitter and emailing a newsletter to 15,000 subscribers.
