International Toast: BILL ROCHE- Tonight's International Toast to the Rotary Club Sao Paulo, Brazil.

Sao Paulo is the largest City in Brazil with a population of over 11 million and a metropolitan population of about 20 million. It is the capital of the south eastern state of Sao Pauo and is also a beehive of activity that offers a jovial nightlife and an intense cultural experience. Sao Paulo is one of the richest cities in the southern hemisphere though the inequality between the classes typically observed in Brazil, is blatant. It is in fact a great city to explore with its own idiosyncrasies, with world class restaurants and diverse regional and international cuisine. Following Sao Paulo's extraordinary growth during the 20th Century most of the old buildings have given way to contemporary architecture leaving down town the only place to see 17th century churches although they are overshadowed by modern sky scrapers. The Rotary Club of Sao Paulo was formed in 1953, has 18 members and meets on Mondays at 12:45 at the Salao Nobra do Colegio. TONY CRAWFORD introduced our guest speaker LEX BITTAR to speak about his great passion, Meals in Wheels, on the list after his family, his career as a teacher, gardening and the bush.

Lex has a history of association with South Wagga Rotary, having helped Don Harper during a previous golf day,
Lexs father was born in Syria, came to Australia at 16 never saw his family again. His older brothers were here, had a drapery
shops in the main street. The family ran Deeps Menswear, the oldest business on its original site in town. The daughter of a
Lebanese orchardist, eloped to Australia married Moses Deep a hawker in the district in the early days. Lex is very proud of his
son who is CEO of British horse racing, was offered the job without face to face interview. Lex indicated that volunteers in
Australia contribute more than 6percent of gross national product and Rotary contributes so much to the community. The social
side of volunteering is extremely worthwhile. Lex encourages us to all enjoy our privileges. Meals on Wheels started in England
during WWII by 2 women with delivered by bike and pram. It started in Australia in Melbourne in 1952. It started in Wagga in 1963
in the Methodist church. Now all meals are frozen and came from local and interstate suppliers. Some recipients take them in
bulk, some get them delivered daily. In Wagga there are 165 clients, and 84 volunteers, lex has been in service for 11 years, is
president, with a committee of 9 and 5 paid staff. The longest client has been receiving meals for 27 years. The committee will
purchase and put microwaves into homes that need them. They also keep an eye on people to make sure that the meals are not
wasted, and well stored in freezers. Many of the volunteers can come at short notice, and are a great group of people.
