

Los Angeles is the most populous city in the state of California, and the second most populous in the United States after New York City with a population of over 3,793,621. It has an area of 469 Square miles and is located in Southern California. The city is the focal point of the Larger Long Beach, Santa Ana metro area with nearly 18 million people. The entire area is recognised as the most diverse of the nations large cities. Los Angeles was founded on September 4th 1781 by the Spanish Governor Filipe de Neve and it became part of Mexico in 1821 following the Mexican War of Independence. In 1848 Los Angeles and the rest of California was purchased by the United States. Los Angeles is a leading world centre of Business, International Trade, entertainment, cultural, media and fashion, and was ranked as the world's 3rd richest city and 5th most influential in the world. The Los Angeles Rotary Club was formed in 1909, has 378 members and meets on Fridays at 11.30 am at the California Club. The President is J. A. Richardson, and the secretary is Alan J Bernstein.

Guest Speaker – Kerry Flinn introduced Guest Speaker Mark Hillas

Mark's father Tom bought the family to Wagga from Melbourne and the Hillas name has been in the industry here in Wagga since 1967. In his father's day selling cars was straightforward, when TV and the Newspapers had a captive audience. Now with Chanel surfing and internet shopping it is harder to sell cars. However China is selling luxury cars in huge numbers due to their large market. The tariffs were prohibitive back then, protecting our car manufacturing industries. Our cars have tariffs overseas now. Leaders are the popular brands Mazda, Mitsubishi Honda in Australia and the big cars like Holdens and Fords have a quite small market share now. Fords have only 8 percent of the market. Different Cars are now built by the same manufacturer, with different badging. Most dealers make money from servicing, used cars and finance. Strong brands sell cars. Struggle to get and keep good tradesmen, need to keep taking in apprentices. Spare parts can be very expensive due to too many brands small numbers sold resulting in often have to buy on demand.
