

International Toast: JOHN RORRISON Tonight's International Toast to the Rotary Club of Lisbon, Portugal.

Lisbon is one of the oldest cities in the world and the oldest in Western Europe predating the modern European capitals such as London, Rome and Paris by centuries. It was ruled by the Germanic tribes from 5th century and captured by the Moors in the 8th century. In 1147 the Crusaders conquered the city and since then it has become the major political economic and cultural centre of Portugal. Lisbon is the westernmost largest city in continental Europe and the only capital on the Atlantic coast. About 3,100,000 people live in the metropolitan area, which is approximately 27% of the country's population. Lisbon enjoys a Mediterranean climate and among all the Metropolises in Europe it has the warmest winters and summer lasts for 6 months from May until October. The Rotary Club of Lisbon was founded in 1926, has 55 members and meets on Tuesdays at 1:00pm at the Tivoli Hotel.
