International Toast: DES HAMILTON- Tonight's International Toast to the **Rotary Club of Omaha**, **Nebdraska USA**.

Omaha is the largest city in the State of Nebraska and is located in the Midwestern United States on the Missouri River. Omaha has a population of over 420,000 and 1.2 million within a radius of 80 kilometres. During the 19th Century Omaha central location in the United States spurred the city to become an important transportation hub, with major rail and highways bisecting the city. In the 20th Century the Omaha stockyards, once the biggest in the world and its meat packing plants gained international prominence. Today Omaha is headquarters to five of the worlds biggest companies including Berkshire Hathaway headed by the legendry Warren Buffett, one of the richest men in the world. Peter thanks the club for the financial assistance to attend the Summer School held on 1-6th December. The students stayed at University of New South Wales. One day they visited ANSTO the only nuclear research facility in Australia and were very impressed with the security of the facility. They had a trivia night, but mobile phones were taken nearly in the competition, which was a very smart move. The University Engineering Faculty was also very securely built and they were show design projects for energy engineering, formula one car parts, and the Barangaroo building site, looking at the environmental engineering at Headland Park, reclaiming the land as natural parkland with future plans for a cultural space.

They were taken to the University of Wollongong, to look at mechanical engineering, their design of a racing car, Blue Scope Steel, and saw the basics of steel making. At the University of Western Sydney, they saw mechanical engineering with robotics and computer design for manufacturing. Another site visit was to

Westrac to look at the large earthmoving equipment, they then went on to the University of Sydney for aeronautical engineering, more kit cars, and formula one racing cars.

Most engineering is computer designed. Peter highly recommends the Honeywell summer school to anyone interested in engineering.
