

Welcome: PRESIDENT LAURIE MYERS - welcomed members, and guest speaker builder Tony McPherson.

International Toast: BRIAN ROY - Tonight's International Toast to the Rotary Club of **Wuppertal**, **Germany**.

Wuppertal is a city in North Rhine-Westphalia, Germany. It is located in and around the river Wupper Valley, and is situated east of the city of Dusseldorf and south of the Ruhr area. With a population of approximately 350,000 it is the largest city in the Bergisches Land. Two thirds of the total municipal area is green space. From any part of the city it is only a ten minute walk to one of the public parks. In the 18th and 19th centuries the Wupper valley was one of the biggest industrial regions of continental Europe. The rising demand for coal from the textile mills and blacksmiths shops laid the roots for the expansion of the Ruhr Valley. Wuppertal is still a major industrial centre, being home to textiles, chemicals, electronics and automobiles. Asprin originates from Wuppertal, as does the vacuum cleaner. The Rotary Club of Wuppertal was formed in 1934 and has 82 members meeting at 1:00pm on Fridays at the Schutzengesellschaft. The President is Dietrich Fudicker, and the Secretary is Axel Jutz.

- Eugene Moloney Eugene is district chair for Interplast and will be visiting clubs to promote Interplast which aims to raise \$35,000 in our district each year to send a team out to international projects in the Asia Pacific region. The Program has been granted full AusAID accreditation. Eugene attended Interplast information seminars in Melbourne, held at The Australasian College of Surgeons in Melbourne, in a very impressive location.

Guest Speakers: STEVE BIGGIN INTRODUCED GUEST SPEAKER TONY MCPHERSON.

Tony gave a very informative talk on the status of the industry in Wagga, the economy, apprenticeship system. Tony is a professional builder. He was born and raised in Tumbarumba, and served his apprenticeship with his father. He went to TAFE in Wagga, he took responsibility for his own learning, working, spending many hours travelling and attending TAFE. He went on to attain his Clerk of Work Certificate, and moved to Wagga to work for a Wagga builder then went out on his own in 1976. His company is quite busy and does mostly government and commercial, work, less residential these days. Wagga has 450-500 new homes built per year, and 1 percent population growth. Pricing is tight, so buyers cannot expect great discounts on prices, otherwise quality is lower. Client expectations are high. The industry has changed over the years. Tony started out working with hand dug and mixed footings, frame cut with hammer and chisel. Today materials are often prefabricated, to save time and costs. Home warrantee insurance has made a big impact. Technology like the mobile phone has made an impact, It has encouraged tradesmen to expect immediate answers, no matter what the builder is doing. There is some positive in new technologies available such as the Constructor software which will estimate the requirements for the job, profit and loss, and potential loss or gain for the job. Apprentices of today rarely know how to use tools. They have a disdain of low wages. Each Apprentices costs start with 3 hours every week training by the tradesman, First year apprentices now do course online not enough face to face time learning from experienced builders. Wagga has fairly good builders, no real dodgy brothers. The future of housing will show moves to photovoltaic solar, and environmental moves away from English style houses. Tony's company won The HIA Quality and Professionalism award last year.
